The Silent Witness The Impact of Domestic Violence on Children

When we think about **domestic violence**, our minds often go to the immediate victims—those experiencing physical, emotional, and psychological abuse at the hands of an abuser. But what about the silent witnesses, the children who live in these households? They may not suffer the physical scars, but the emotional wounds can last a lifetime. Researchers have estimated that **between 3.3 million and 10 million children are exposed to adult domestic violence each year**.

Domestic violence doesn't just harm the direct victims—its impact can ripple through the family. Children who witness abuse often experience deep, lasting trauma that affects their development, relationships, and emotional well-being. There can be **short and long-term effects of domestic violence** or **abuse** on children, such as: acting out in school, becoming more aggressive, withdrawing from friends and family, increased risk of substance abuse in adulthood, and difficulties forming healthy relationships later in life.

Some children may even assume the role of a caregiver, feeling responsible for their parent's well-being, or believe they are somehow at fault for the violence they witness. These responses often go unnoticed or misunderstood, especially when families feel isolated by the stigma surrounding **domestic violence**.

Sadly, children who grow up in homes with **domestic violence are at a greater risk of continuing the cycle**—whether as future victims or perpetrators. **Each child responds differently to trauma and abuse**, a child's successful recovery depends on them having a good support system, high selfesteem, and healthy friendships. The healing process can't erase the memory, but children can learn healthier coping methods as they mature. **Breaking this cycle** requires early intervention, supportive counseling, and an environment that promotes healing.

Pee Dee Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual Assault (PDC) understands the critical need to address the impact of **domestic violence** on children. In the event of suspected child abuse, there are **Durant Children's Center** various on-site services, such as: 24-hour crisis intervention, medical examinations, diagnosis, and treatment, forensic interview, individual and group counseling, legal assistance and more.

Every child deserves a safe, loving environment free from fear and harm. By focusing on **breaking the cycle of violence** and providing care and support, we can protect these vulnerable children and help them build a future full of hope and opportunity. Together, we can ensure that the next generation grows up knowing love, safety, and peace.

Vote when your abuser is busy.

Consider vote-by-mail options.

Do Research beforehand and vote quickly.

Ask a poll worker about secret voting.

Practice self-care before and after voting.

Ask a friend to support you.

Each survivor should be empowered to decide what is helpful or appropriate for them when engaging in the political process, and that process should always be safe, private, and trauma-informed.
